The annual National Western Stock Show in Denver, Colorado broke records with its attendance for the first weekend. Huge crowds showed up to attend rodeos, livestock shows, horse shows, shopping, etc. The opening Saturday attendance was 58,901. The previous record was 57,386 in 2020.

Paul Andrews, the President of the National Western Stock Show says that he believes TV shows such as Yellowstone and 1923 have helped bring western values and western heritage into view. STOCK SHOW 2023

The next building that Sargent FFA looked at was the Hydro Building. This building recently opened on January 6, 2023. The Hydro Building provides more opportunities for Denver Water to collaborate with the community. The last building toured was Vida. This was the first SPUR building to open on, January 7, 2022. The Vida building embodies the connectivity between human and animal life. At the end of the tour, Ashlyn got to show the chapter where all of the state officers live and get to pursue their dreams. This was a great opportunity for the Sargent FFA chapter to see a different side of agriculture.
